

### Homework progression through Lanner Primary School

<b>FSU:</b>	Reading; topic related activities; phonics activities.
<b>Year One:</b>	Reading; sight words as appropriate; home learning grid.
<b>Year Two:</b>	Reading; weekly maths activity; home learning grid.
<b>Year Three:</b>	Reading; weekly maths activity/ multiplication tables; home learning grid.
<b>Year Four:</b>	Reading; weekly maths activity/ multiplication tables; home learning grid.
<b>Year Five:</b>	Reading; Spellings; My Maths; Times tables / maths problems.
<b>Year Six:</b>	Reading: Levelled maths homework; grammar workbooks; times tables.

### READING

Children at Lanner School, from the youngest in FSU to the oldest in year 6, are expected to read regularly at home. The new National Curriculum places a much greater emphasis on the role of parents in their child's reading development and expects schools to have ***"ambitious expectations for reading at home."*** At Lanner, we expect ***all*** children to ***read at home 5 times a week with an adult***. This could be their ***school reading book, listening to a story read by someone else or sharing a favourite book***. All are equally valuable. Older children who prefer to read to themselves should ***discuss their reading*** with an adult to ensure that they have understood what they have read.
