Letter from the Head



Dear Parent and Carers,

I hope you have had a good week and are keeping well and healthy.

It was great to see so many children taking part in after school clubs this week. We know that more will be starting next week too, which is great news. A personal thank you to all the teachers and support staff for giving up their time to run these clubs. It makes such a difference to have our own staff running these clubs, and it also keeps the costs down. Clubs such as Football Club are hugely oversubscribed, so we filter it down into groups to ensure all children get the opportunity to experience it.

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
