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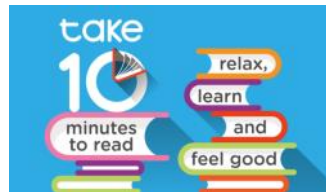
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Reading Challenge!



We have launched our 'Reading Zone' book challenge, where we will be encouraging the children to read from different 'zones' – perhaps choosing something different to what they would normally choose and to read for their own enjoyment. The reading zones are fiction, non-fiction, books from the school library, comics and graphic novels, books recommended by friends or by someone at home, audio books, online books, newspaper articles, and a range of wellbeing books (displayed on classroom doors). We are asking children to read as many books as they can from as many different 'zones' as they can between now and Friday 4th November. When your child has read a book from one of the zones they will be given a label to stick on our whole-school reading zone poster. The aim is for us, as a school, to cover all the zones on the poster. If we manage to do this, we will be able to enter into a national competition to win the wellbeing books for our school. We would really appreciate your support in helping us to help your child to **love** reading!
