



Dear Parent and Carers,

I hope you have had a great week. It has been lovely to see so many of you coming in to meet your class teachers this week. It feels like a lifetime ago since we had the opportunity to do this, and I was genuinely so pleased that we managed to do so. Sadly, you will have probably heard cases of Covid 19 are back on the rise again, so getting things in early seems to be a smart idea. Or pure luck! Hopefully, we will not see any restrictions being reintroduced, but with rising numbers and the implications this can have with staff etc, we always must tread cautiously. It is probably a good time to readdress Covid 19, as we have seen a small number of cases in our school this week.

Covid 19: Firstly, the DfE have advised that there is no expectation for people to be testing for Covid 19, and if people and children are well enough, then they should attend school. However, in contrast to this the NHS are advising people to self-isolate for 5 days, or until well, before returning to work or school if they test positive. So once again we have slightly tricky guidance. The school's stance on this is as follows: there are no expectations or laws to test - or not to test. If you do decide to take a test and the results are positive, then please adhere to the NHS guidelines. That said, I would also encourage you to contact the school office or myself and we will happily advise or support in anyway we can. The last thing we want is children missing school unnecessarily, however as we know, every family circumstance is different, and we do not want to be spreading this virus around unnecessarily either. It is a fine balancing act once again.

Other news: Hopefully, you will have had the chance to see your child's books. You will have noticed we now have separate books for all subjects this year. This is to ensure that children really understand the sequencing of learning, and it gives them a better opportunity to look back at previous learning; to understand key concepts and facts. Your 'Key Vocabulary and Knowledge Tables' that are sent home every half term are so important. Any reinforcement of the learning that takes place is school has a huge positive impact, and really taps into the children's long-term memory. Alternatively, please drop your child's class teacher a message on dojo or seesaw and we will happily accommodate.


