Wednesday 7th June 2023 - Class group photos

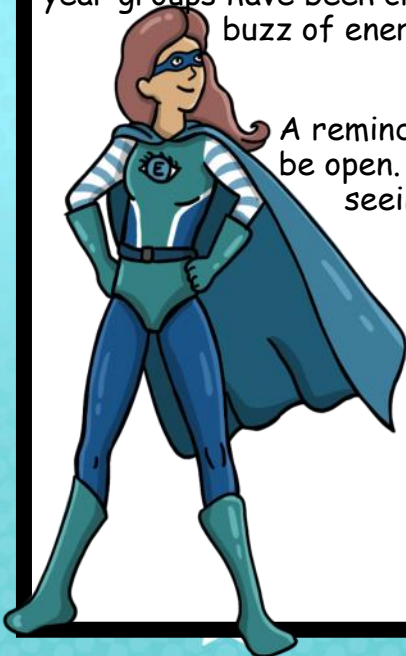
Monday 19th June 2023 - Start of Sports week
