Letter from the Head



Dear Parent and Carers,

I hope you have had a fantastic week. The weather has been much improved - which was needed - long may it continue.

This week we have seen lots of outdoor activities and trips getting under way. The year 4's spent the day in Truro, the year 3's are off to Portreath next week and the residentials for year 3, 4 & 5 are getting prepped and finalised as we speak. I thought I'd give you a bit of background info on the reasoning behind our residential trips i.e. the how and why. We start at year R, taking the children on very small trips around the local area - even the school field is a huge excitement for this age group, and we gradually build up their confidence. In Y1 we start taking the children out to museums and plan in class parties etc. Then there is the added fun of school discos etc - all part of building up the children's confidence and independence. These trips continue to build through \$\tilde{7}\$2 and we purposely plan a few trips that are a bit further away. When we move up to KS2, we of course continue with the school trips - but also plan in residentials. These overnight stays are incredibly exciting for the children; however, they can be challenging for some children, so we take it nice and slow. We are also very aware of the rising costs of these trips, so our residential plan starts with Y3 - a movie night, fish and chips and a sleepover in the school building. Y4 - some sort of activity day i.e. surfing or coasteering - then either camping in tents on the school grounds, or a stay over off the school grounds (we try and keep the cost to Y3 & 4 as low as possible). Y5 then head out of county for a 2-night camping residential with the final big trip left for Y6, who head to London for 3 days. We aim for 100% for all of these trips - especially the bigger ones in the later years as they really do make fantastic lifelong memories. I also know how hard it is for parents... at the time of writing this, my own son is on his Y5 school camp, and I have had sleepless nights. The emotions for parents (in my experience) are fear, worry... a bit of not wanting him to grow up and become more independent, plus lots of crazy 'what ifs'... I am working on my own strategies to deal with these little anxieties, and so far the best strategy has been; have a glass of wine and enjoy having the TV control for once. I do of course joke - however, I know it goes so quick and I also know that he will have an amazing time... Or, if he doesn't have an amazing time, for whatever

reason, he will have learnt valuable life lessons and grown a little more as a person. So, it's all good. If you are in anyway anxious or worried about these

trips, please reach out to us.

Anyway, I thought I'd share the strategy behind our trips here at Lanner and how carefully we plan the children's personal development.
