Refugee- a person who leaves the country they live in, to go and live in another country. Migrant- a person who migrates(moves) to another country to find work or better living conditions. Asylum seeker-a person who leaves their own country due to worry about what might happen to them if they stayed. Continent- a landmass. Country-an area of land that is controlled by its own government. Region- A region is an area of land that has similar features. Regions, large or small, are the basic units of geography. County- An area that is run by local government. A county usually consists of several towns and the rural areas that surround them. City- a large town which is densely populated. They usually have a cathedral but not always and have been awarded city status by the Queen. Locate: find Local: near to Human characteristics/features-how human activity influences the Earth's Surface. Physical characteristics/features- natural features of a place (hills, mountains, coasts and rivers) Population-a community of humans living in the same place.	Refugees, migrants and asylum seekers are people who leave the country they are currently in to live somewhere else. Continents are landmasses. The world has 7 continents: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Europe, Australia and Antarctica. The countries in the United Kingdom are: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. Continents are divided into countries. Countries are divided into regions. The regions of England are: The North West, The North East, The East Midlands, The West Midlands, East Anglia, The South West, The South East and Yorkshire and Humberside. Regions are divided into counties. The counties local to us are: Cornwall, Devon, Somerset, Gloucestershire, Dorset and Wiltshire. The 8 most populated cities in the UK are: London, Birmingham, Manchester, Glasgow, Newcastle, Sheffield, Liverpool and Leeds. Human geographical features include landmarks such as cathedrals, monuments, bridges, buildings and stadiums.
