




YEAR 5 RE – What does it mean to Christians if God is holy and loving? (SPR 1)

Holy – to be absolutely pure and perfect, without sin.	A god might be many different things to different people, depending on their beliefs.	  
Loving – feeling or showing strong feelings of care and affection.	Christians believe that their God is omniscient (all-knowing), omnipotent (all-powerful), holy, loving, eternal.	
Spirit – the non-physical being; without a body.	Christians believe that cathedrals were built to show the power of God. Different aspects of a cathedral represent God, e.g. the stories in stained glass windows, the altar.	
Eternal – not limited by time; forever.		
Omniscient – knowing all things.	To Christians, God is loving which means that God wants the very best for humans and does a lot to care for them.	Agreed Syllabus End Points
Omnipotent – all powerful.	Christians also believe that God is holy. To Christians, this could mean that God is morally pure and is separate to humans, who may be sinful. Christians believe that God is both loving and holy which means that although God doesn't want humans to commit sins, he does forgive.	
Psalm – Christian or Jewish sacred verse.		
Prophet – a person regarded as a teacher or proclaimer of God's will.		
Cathedral – the principal Christian church in a diocese, with a bishop.	People have different beliefs. Some people believe in God or several Gods; some people do not believe in any god. Diocese – a Christian area under the pastoral and religious care of a bishop.	Humanists believe that they can live their life without the guidance of a god. Some people believe they can have non-religious guidelines for living in a kind and caring way.	
Justice – morally right or fair.		Make connections: <ul style="list-style-type: none">Make connections between Christian teachings (e.g. about peace, forgiveness, healing) and the issues, problems and opportunities in the world today, including their own livesArticulate their own responses to the issues studied, recognising different points of view.
Mercy – kindness and forgiveness towards others.
