




## YEAR 5 RE – What matters most to Christians and Humanists? (Sum 2)

<p><b>Humanism:</b> a set of non-religious ideas about how people should live.</p>	<p>Humanists believe that there is often a link between good or bad thoughts and the behaviour that follows. These behaviours lead to positive or negative consequences. Some religious people believe that following religious rules, or commandments, can help them to make the right choices.</p> <p>Many humanists follow a code for living and try to live a good life. Some identify with the following principles: be honest; use your mind; tell the truth; do to other people what you would like them to do to you.</p>	<div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;">   </div>	
<p><b>Humanist:</b> a person who lives by the ideas or beliefs of Humanism.</p>			
<p><b>Atheist:</b> a person who believes in no god.</p>			
<p><b>Commandments:</b> a set of behaviour rules, as in 'The Ten Commandments'.</p>			
<p><b>Conscience:</b> a person's moral sense of right and wrong; seen as an internal guide to our behaviour.</p>	<p>The Christian Bible tells many stories of Jesus and the values that were important to him. For many Christians, the values that are important include love, forgiveness, peace between people and God, honesty, prayer, worship and fellowship (togetherness).</p>	<h3>Agreed Syllabus End Points</h3>	
<p><b>Consequence:</b> the result of an action.</p>			
<p><b>Values:</b> principles or standards of behaviour; our judgement of what is important in life.</p>	<p>Many Christians and Humanists share important values, such as the idea of peace. Even when values are not shared, people can disagree respectfully. Disagreement does not have to lead to conflict and fighting.</p>		<p>Identify and explain beliefs about why people are good and bad.</p> <p>Make links with sources of authority that tell people how to be good.</p> <p>Make clear connections between Christian and Humanist ideas about being good and how people live</p>
<p><b>Peace:</b> freedom from disturbance; tranquillity.</p>	<p>A code for living can be used by all people to live a better life, regardless of their religion or belief. Many humanists believe that they should focus on 'rules' for their own behaviour; how they behave in their relationships with family and friends; how they behave as part of society; and their behaviour towards the environment.</p>		<p>Suggest reasons why it might be helpful to follow a moral code and why it might be difficult, offering different points of view</p>
<p><b>Tolerance:</b> the ability or willingness to accept others' rights to opinions or beliefs that you dislike or disagree with.</p>			<p>Raise important questions and suggest answers about how &amp; why people should be good</p>
<p><b>Harmony:</b> the result of agreement and acceptance.</p>			<p>Make connections between the values studied and their own lives, &amp; their importance in the world today, giving good reasons for their views.</p>
